## Writing Workshop with Mrs. Sakai

In this attachment, you are going to find materials to support you in an independent writing project. What is an independent writing project you ask? Well, it is a project that YOU, the writer, designs around the kind of text and topic that you want to write. You are the one in charge of your writing life and now you get to direct every part! Would you like to write a fantasy story? A teaching book about narwhals? A comic book with some of your favorite characters? A recipe book that holds all of the special recipes of your family? A songbook filled with original songs by you? The sky is the limit. In this project, you will:

- Generate a variety of ideas and topics for projects
- Select one and think about audience and purpose
- Plan it out
- Find a mentor text to support you in the specific kind of writing that you have chosen
- Learn to make work plans and use tools to support your writing
- Revise your writing to make it stronger
- Edit your writing to make it the way you want your reader to read it
- Publish it and think about how to get it into the hands of the audience you want to see it

For each session, there are tools such as charts or planning sheets that can support the work of the mini-lesson. You will also find a list of YouTube video links organized by session. Just click the session you are on and it will direct you to the video.

#### Grades K-2

- A writing tool-pen or pencil
- Paper (there will soon be paper choices in the sessions for you to choose from, though I can also say just plain paper is great so they can design the page exactly how they want it to be)
- Coloring tools
- A mentor text

### Independent Writing Project K-2 Mini-Lesson Summaries Sheet

#### Session I:

Writers can make a list or draw pictures to remind themselves of all of the topics they love. Next think about the kind of book you want to make. Writers call this the genre of the book. Will yours be a teaching book? A story book? A comic book? A question and answer book?
- Step 3: Writer's Work: Use the generating ideas sheet (attached), a notebook, a plain piece of paper, something, to generate topics that are interesting to you. Then think about the type of book you want to make.
